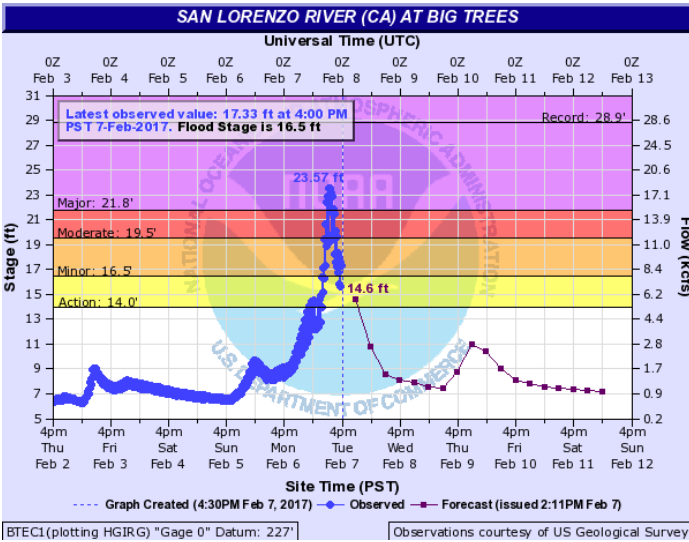

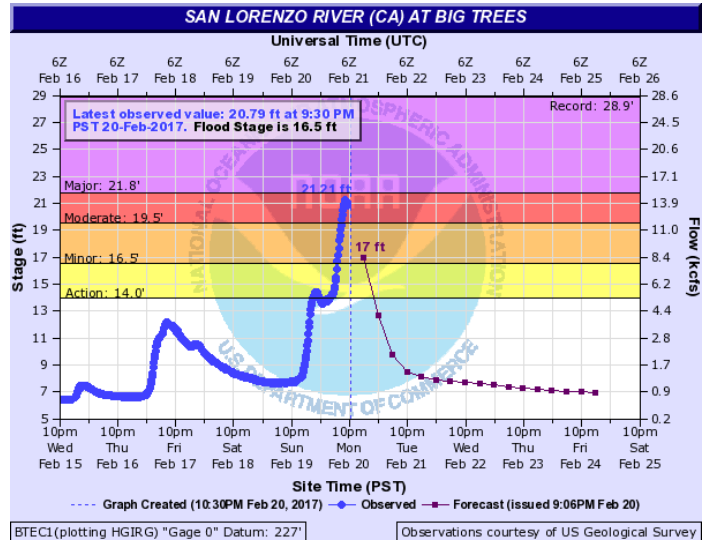

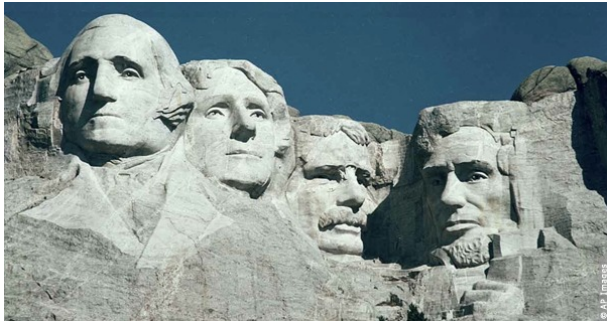

For those of us who have been in Monteville for awhile, we totally get it. However, there are many of you newer folks who perhaps have not had the opportunity to experience one of her bi-yearly concerts here at Ye Ole Mill. If you have not, perhaps you will want to consider it in 2017. She directs a concert in June and December every year with the chorale and the bell choir. There are many folks who come from outside of the park to enjoy these performances. When notices go out it is important to respond ASAP because they usually sell out.

No one would ever suspect that she sits at her computer hour after hour, day after day, week after week listening to music to select for her current theme so that it would all flow effortlessly into a meaningful lovely performance. She has been doing this voluntarily for 15 years and simultaneously directs a bell choir at First United Methodist Church with rehearsals once a week for performances on Sunday. Overall she has directed bell choirs for 40+ years and chorale groups for 60+ years. Also, she switches over to the piano to lead audiences in sing-a-longs as well as plays with our accompanist, Carolyn Christian for occasional four-handed piano pieces with the chorale.

You get all this talent, along with the 12 volunteers of Bellissimo and the nearly 40 of the chorale who put in 17 rehearsals for each concert, for ONLY \$8. This money goes to buy music and pay our instrumentalists which she has added the past several years for the overall affect. At the end of the entertainment, there is an assortment of goodies and drinks to share.

What a bargain as well as a good chance to thank Darlene and the many participants who spend so many hours preparing to entertain you. **Tenors and basses who read music are always needed so if you are out there, make yourselves known.** The next concert will be **June 10th and 11th**. Be sure to experience Monteville's **JEWEL** in 2017.
